

# Manger Messages: A Christmas Activity for All Ages

## Instructions

Our prayer is that **Manger Messages** would provide meaningful opportunities for families to share in the incredible unfolding of Christ's birth through nativity-themed Scripture messages and inspirational images. As you create (and re-create!) nativity scenes throughout this season and into the New Year, may your hearts be drawn to worship.

Scripture Cards - sets 1 and 2 (cardstock recommended)

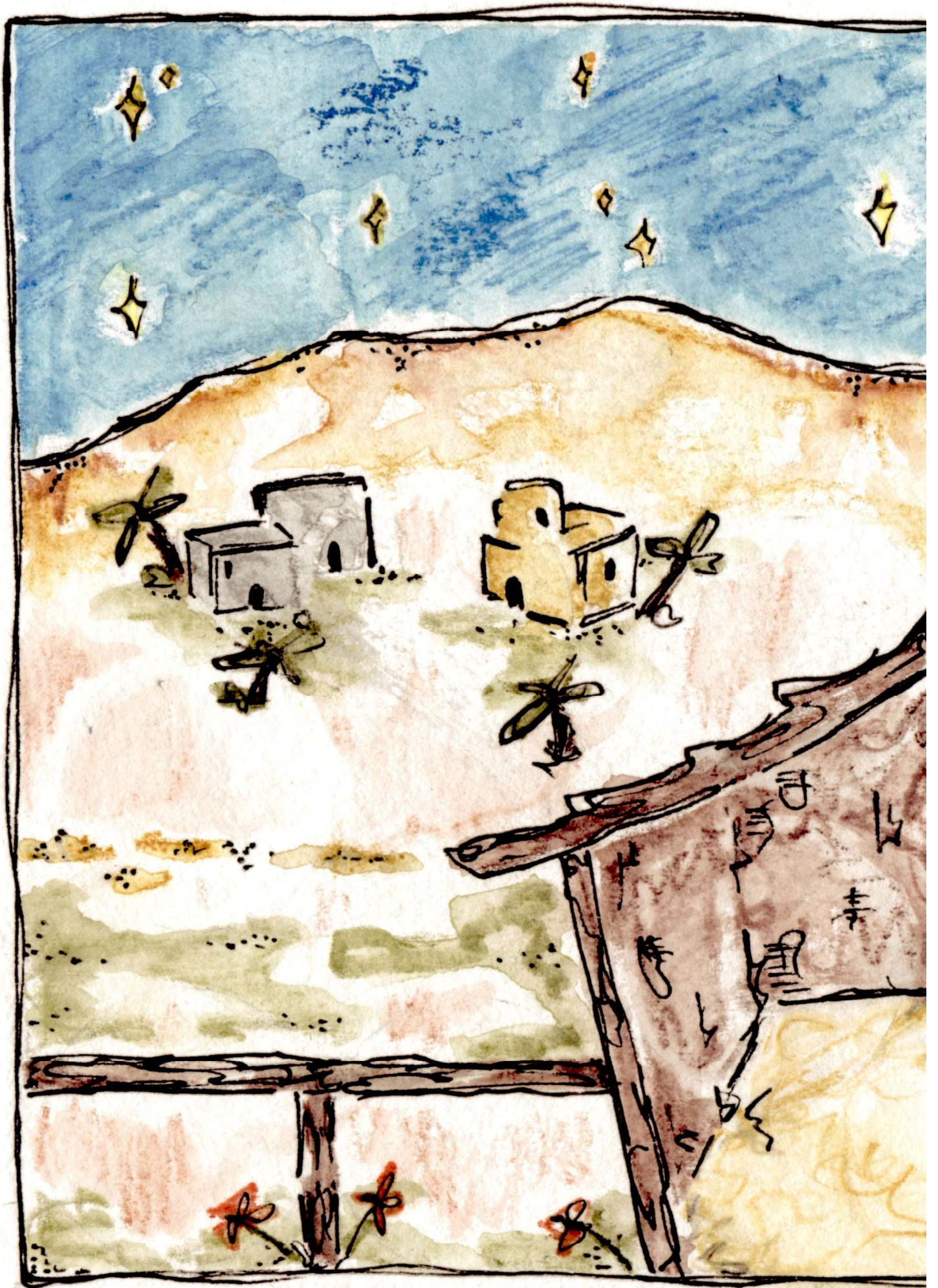

### Prepare Game Pieces:

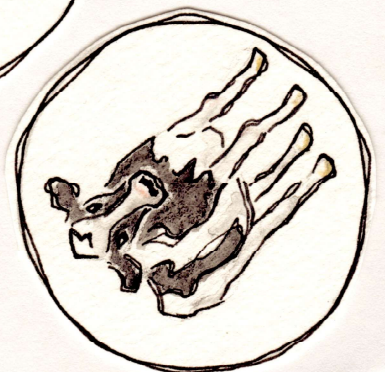
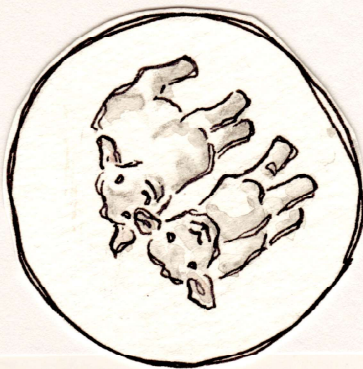
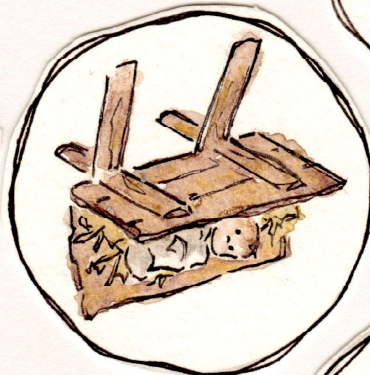
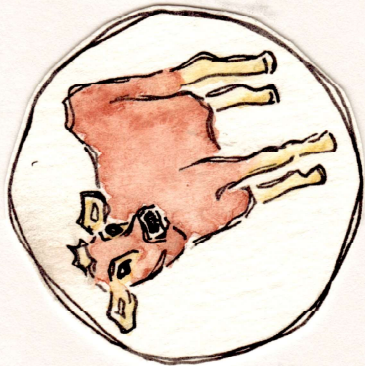
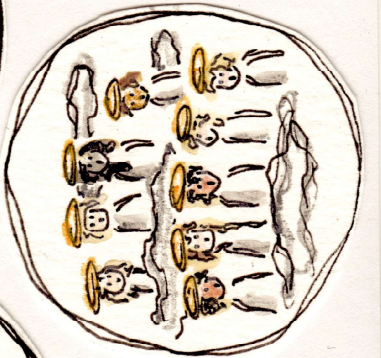
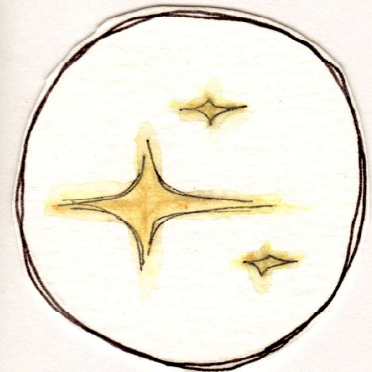
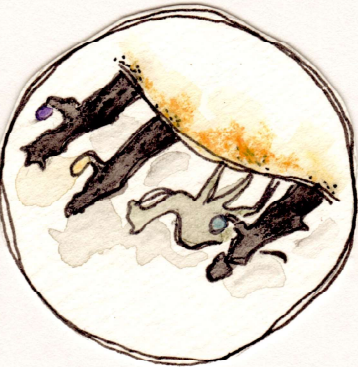
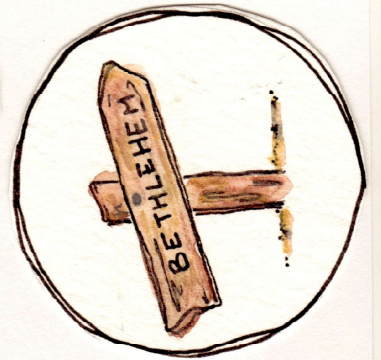
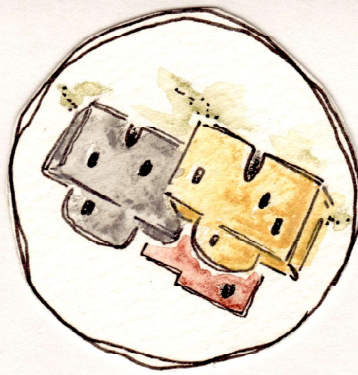
- Assemble Nativity Scene Backdrop: line up left and right sheets of 8 ½ by 11 paper to create the complete nativity scene. (These can be taped together from behind or glued/taped to a stronger surface.)
- Cut out Character Discs, 18 in all.
- Cut out Scripture Cards, 18 in all. (If you would like to include the Bethlehem image on the backs of each card, print double-sided.)

### To Play:

- Place Nativity Scene on playing surface.
- Shuffle Scripture Cards. Place face down on playing surface.
- Spread out Character Discs, face up, on playing surface. (*Alternate play: shuffle and distribute Character Discs among players.*)
- Players take turns drawing Scripture Cards. Read the passage (some passages are featured more than once) and select corresponding Character Disc, placing it on the Nativity Scene as desired. Place Scripture Card in discard pile. (*Alternate play: player holding corresponding image adds his/her Character Disc to Nativity Scene.*)
- Play is complete once all Character Discs have been added to the Nativity Scene. (*Alternate play: a "winner" is declared when a player becomes the first to add each of his/her Character Discs to the Nativity Scene . . . but only as long as someone has already added Baby Jesus!*)



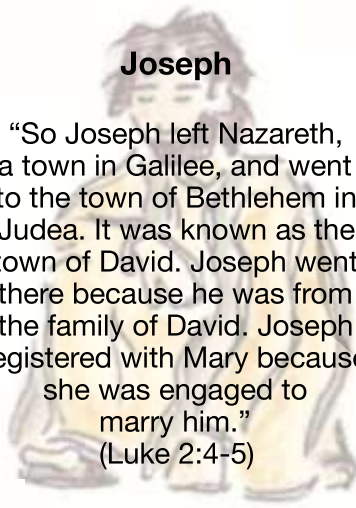




## Manger Messages: Scripture Cards Set 1

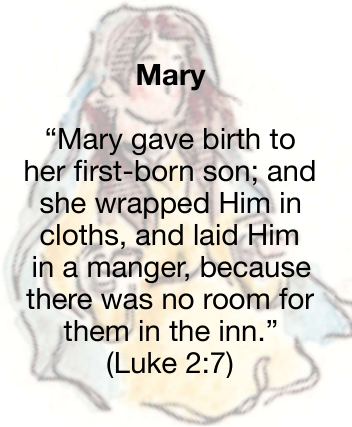
### Joseph

(Luke 2:4-5)



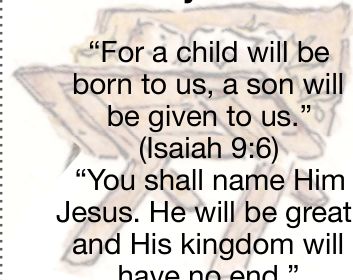
### Mary

(Luke 2:7)



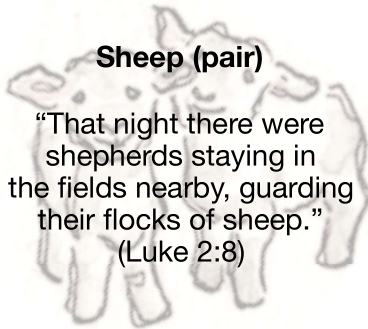
### Baby Jesus

(Luke 1:31-33)



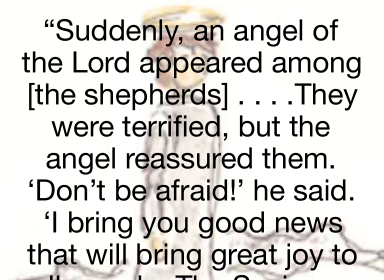
### Sheep (pair)

(Luke 2:8)



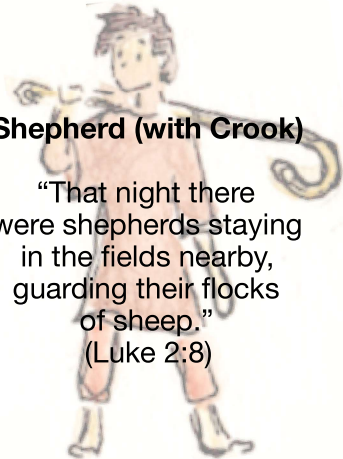
### Angel

(Luke 2:9-11)



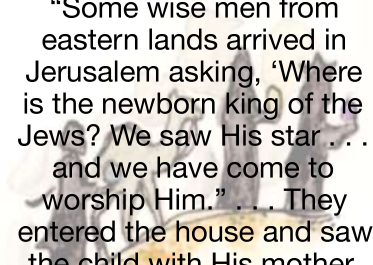
### Shepherd (with Crook)

(Luke 2:8)



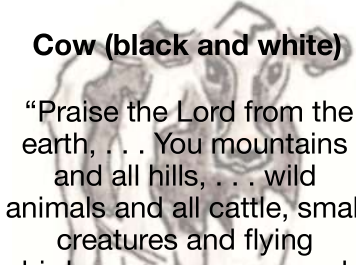
### Wise Men

(From Matthew 2)



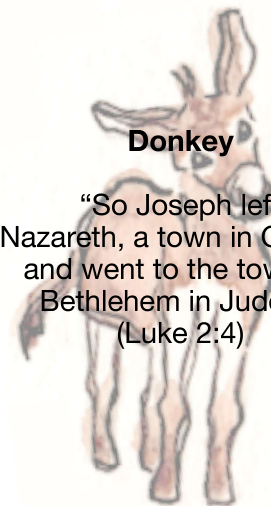
### Cow (black and white)

(from Psalm 148)

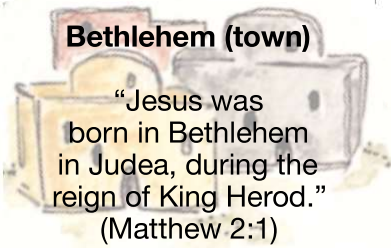


### Donkey

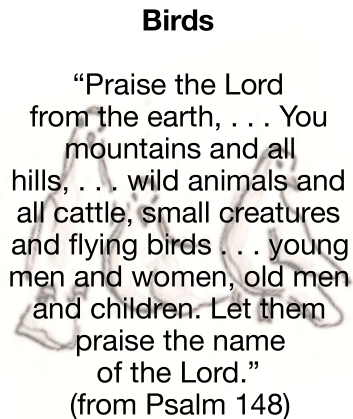


## Manger Messages: Scripture Cards Set 2



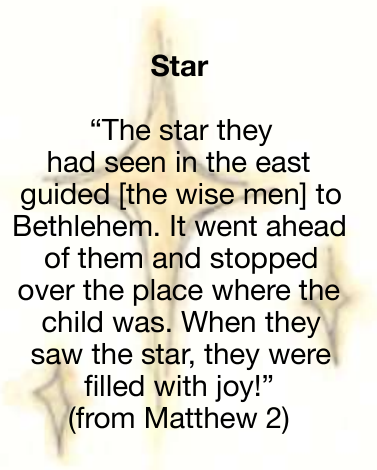
### **Bethlehem (town)**

(Matthew 2:1)



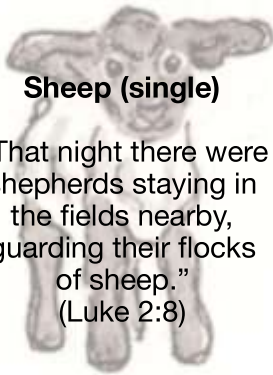
### **Birds**

(from Psalm 148)



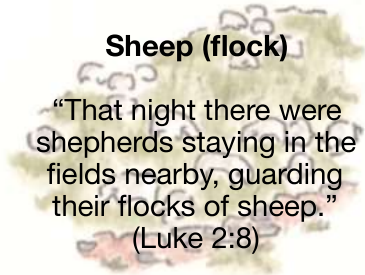
### **Star**

(from Matthew 2)



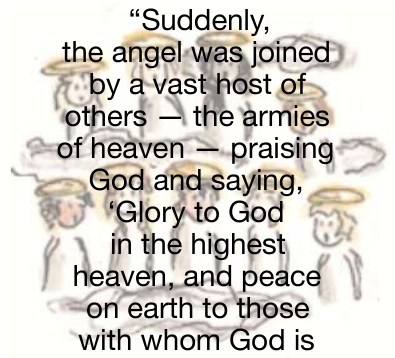
### **Sheep (single)**

(Luke 2:8)



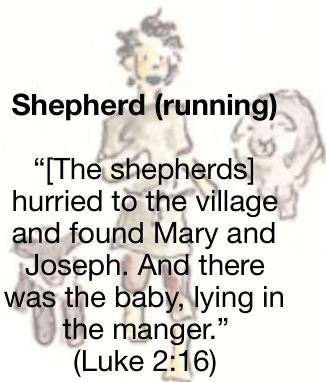
### **Sheep (flock)**

(Luke 2:13-14)



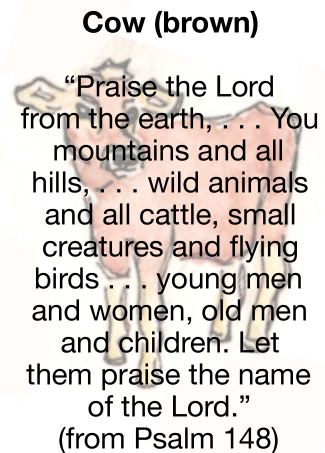
### **Shepherd (running)**
